# MINUTES OF MEETING OF TUROSS HEAD PROGRESS ASSOCIATION HELD AT KYLA HALL on 6 NOVEMBER 2025

## 1. WELCOME

President Ross welcomed all to the meeting including visitors Kathryn Maxwell of SHASA and Trish of TECEXEC who gave an excellent presentation on disaster recovery once the initial formalities were completed.

#### PRESENTATION:

Kathryn Maxwell SHASA briefly commented on the evacuation centre situation of 2020 where overcrowding and lack of alternative facilities caused heat and safety issues. Communications issues were also a major concern. Since 2020 SHASA has been actively involved in obtaining grants and supporting local areas to provide emergency facilities and upgrade existing facilities to standards suitable for disaster recovery. Local Councils have been very supportive in their work as the needs became more apparent from the research undertaken subsequent to the 2019/2020 fires.

A very interesting detail which came out of the SHASA presentation was that the ESC is now actively engaged with SHASA and other authorities in looking at communications and support in emergency situations. Preserving our beautiful environment has provided an avenue of approach which seems amenable to ESC. For the past 5 years despite numerous approaches to ESC by THPA little progress has been made on securing an upgrade of our existing facilities from neighbourhood safe place to fully resourced evacuation facilities. Perhaps the experiences of the 2020 bushfires and understanding of the damage done is filtering through. Additionally government grants are becoming more available and there is a change of staff at ESC.

The period 2020-2025 has seen the first part of the SASHA program with many successes. As part of the second thrust of SHASA'S program to take place over the next 5 years, Tuross Head will be a focus along with other villages/townships not already attended to.

A great step forward for Tuross is that the Country Club has been in touch with Dr Holland regarding upgrading their facilities to a standard suitable for emergency use and SHASA have offered to be actively engaged in assisting Tuross.

President Ross commented that SHASA need support in this – we have got to become more active as a community. We need to help Kathryn in this area to help care for the beautiful world we all live in. THPA has the ability of the community – we need to put signs up around the shops and broadcast our needs as often as possible. Chris smith commented that a calendar giving the year's meeting dates in the notice boards could be helpful in broadcasting THPA activities as well as information about specific issues.

Trish from TecExec provided lots of information about communications advances for our regional area as well as information about portable satellite communication called Star Link currently in operation in Eurobodalla. Can be attached to car roof. Trish gave a list of the 'Aps' and websites which could be most helpful in the event of an emergency including the BOM; Hazards Near Me; Radio, Mobile Phone - ABC listen Ap; and Facebook – ABC South East NSW; RFS and SES websites. The important thing for all is to stay connected.
